Most melanomas start as new spots



I've had several friends lately who

have been diagnosed with melanoma on their skin. So I was interested to find out in the latest issue of *Harvard Women's Health Watch* that a recent study found that more often than not, melanoma occurs as a new spot on your body - not as changes in an existing mole. The *Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology* reported that only 29% of melanomas came from an existing mole on the body that changed. In 71% of cases, melanoma occurred in a new lesion that popped up in a new place on the skin. So, in addition to looking for new and unusual spots on your skin, we need to remember the ABCD's to spot the signs of melanoma:

- A asymmetric appearance
- B irregular borders
- C multiple colors in the lesion
- D a diameter larger than 6 mms

Melanomas are commonly found on the head and neck, upper back, torso and lower legs. Finding it early can help you find it when it is most treatable. Good information to know.

Emergency Night Light - The "EcoSurvivor" light plugs directly into a wall socket to work as a night light, and functions as both a batterypowered tabletop light and flashlight

to have on hand during emergencies and power outages. The light will automatically switch to battery power and turn on when the power goes out when it is plugged in to a wall socket. This emergency night light can be purchased at Lowes for about \$10.00.

Water dripping from my bathroom ceiling vent, what is going on??

Some unit owners, including myself, have noticed water dripping from the ceiling vents in the bathrooms. Do I need a plumber?



The apparent cause of this is that humidity inside the unit is drawn into


the vent and because of the cold attic, water condenses on the inside wall of the vent hose carrying air to the outside up through the attic, making the water drip back down the vent hose into the bathroom and drips onto the floor. Since warm air rises, the warm air will make it up through the vent whether you turn the vent fan on or not. This is very apparent when the outside temperature is in the single digits or teens. Solution is not a clear one, except to put a folded towel on the floor to catch the water drips. If staining does occurs on the ceiling around the vent, wait until Springtime when you will no longer have this water/drip problem to get rid of the stain. Pat the stain with a small amount of bleach that you put on a damp sponge, then let the ceiling dry. The stain should fade with the bleach solution. You may have to do this twice to get rid of a heavy stain. Works for me.

Just when we thought we had figured out how to protect our computers and personal information from hackers, new threats to our security have appeared in the form of two critical computer chip flaws.

The exploits, known as Meltdown and Spectra, take advantage of a process built into every modern computer chip called "speculative execution". Simply described, this process makes chips run faster by allowing them to predict what tasks your computer or phone may need and execute them beforehand whether you will use the specific task or not. If not, the task is discarded. Hackers could exploit flaws in this predictive process to gain access to protected areas of the system's memory where sensitive data is saved or cached. Passwords, encryption keys, login info and even files could be read and stolen.

This is the first time a processor's "speculative execution" process has been found to be exploitable. Since this process is a core technique in all modern chips, this discovery will change the way computer chips are designed and manufactured in the future.

Meltdown, specific to Intel chips, was the first design flaw discovered. To fix this flaw, the chip's memory must be completely separated from the user processes. This can be done with a software patch. Unfortunately, this fix was found to slow down Intel-based computers. Intel claims that these slowdowns are not significant, depend on the tasks being performed and will not significantly affect the average user.

The second exploit, Spectre, is thought to be the worse of the two. Unlike Meltdown, it effects chips from every manufacturer – Advanced Micro Devices (AMD), ARM and Intel – placing every PC, tablet and smartphone at risk. In addition, Spectre appears to attack another basic design flaw in how the processor works and therefore cannot be simply fixed with a software patch.

Fortunately, it is believed that these vulnerabilities have NOT been exploited yet and there appears to be no evidence that hackers are actively abusing them. Technical details about the flaws are still scarce, so hardware and software vendors have some time to act. But, since the existence of these flaws is now publicly known, issuing patches and security updates to mitigate these flaws will be the first order of business for all hardware and software vendors.

What can you do to protect yourself against these threats?

1. Since both Meltdown and Spectre require some sort of malware delivery system to bring and install these exploits on your computer or phone, keeping your gadgets updated with the latest software and following the basic computer safety practices discussed in previous articles should protect you from these threats.

Avoid clicking on unknown links and attachments on emails, avoid clicking on website ads that may harbor malicious code and refrain from installing software and apps from questionable sources.

2. Prepare for the inevitable updates from Microsoft, Apple and Google. Microsoft will download its fixes in its Patch Tuesday updates for supported Windows systems. If your Windows machine is not set to download and install updates automatically, click Start (Windows logo), choose "Settings," select "Update & Security," then on the "Windows Update" section, click on "Advanced Options." Under "Advanced Options, "make sure the drop-down box is set to "Automatic."

Apple has confirmed that Macs, iPhones, iPads, and Apple TVs are all impacted by either Meltdown or Spectre. The company has already released mitigations for Meltdown in iOS 11.2, macOS 10.12.2, and tvOS 11.2.

Google has issued security patches for its Nexus and Pixel phones. Although the software fixes are ready, rollouts for other Android phones from companies like Samsung and LG will depend on the carrier and the phone manufacturers themselves. Keep checking for the latest updates for your Android gadget and apply them ASAP.

To manually update your Android gadget, Go to Settings >> scroll down, click on 'About Phone' or 'About Tablet.' (If you have a tabbed settings menu then this will appear in the 'general' section) >> click software update >> click install now, install overnight, or later. (con't on page 10)

January Board of Governors (BOG) News



Hopefully everyone read their Annual Budget Report. We finished 2017 with a deficit, but most of it was due to using the 2014/2015 insurance claim monies for the front porch project (an accounting process). The Board will do their best to make sure that in 2018 we don't have a deficit.

During the Annual Budget Meeting it was mentioned that the garage door gaskets at 7 and 12 Strawberry had not been replaced. These gaskets have now been replaced. It was also mentioned that there are mice in the shed. Five poisonous traps have been placed inside the shed; hopefully this resolves the issue.

We are still waiting on the replacement of the inside pressure reducers at 2A Strawberry and 4H Rotherham due to high pressure readings for the buildings. The vendor has been tied up with fixing frozen pipes and will schedule this replacement as quickly as possible.

Two catch basins are in need of repair. They have been reviewed by ARMAX and will be fixed in the spring.

The water issue on the circle driveway at 6/11 Autumn has also been reviewed by ARMAX. We can't do much until spring, but there may be a drywell under the road or in the circle grass/flower bed area that has an issue. More news as this issue is addressed.

As many of you are aware, the alarm at the fire kiosk has been going off frequently. The Board met with two fire alarm maintenance companies to determine how we resolve this situation. We are dealing with a ground fault issue or issues. We have been told that one of the downsides to underground wiring is that over time cable covers start to deteriorate and the cables become wet. This in turn causes the alarm to go off and the panel inside the fire kiosk to indicate there is a ground fault. Once the cables dry out, the alarm for a ground fault should go off. In 2016 we replaced the telephone connection to the Hudson Fire Department with a Wi-Fi box. It doesn't appear that it was programmed correctly. No call list was set up and no one is notified when the alarm goes off. The Board is also unclear if the panel on the side of the kiosk is working properly. Following the selection of an alarm maintenance vendor the initial steps are to reprogram the Wi-Fi box with a

call list, make sure the panel on the side of the kiosk is working and locate a fire system junction box at every building. Fixing the ground fault situation is like "opening a can of worms" and expensive, but must be addressed.

To date the Board feels that Dave's Landscaping has done an outstanding job of clearing our roads, driveways, and porches of snow and ice. Last week they came back to make sure our catch basins were cleared prior to the rain. While here they also cleared the remaining snow from the satellite parking areas. The contract clearly states that cars must be moved from satellite parking prior to Dave's Landscaping leaving the property so these area may be plowed. If you park a vehicle in satellite parking during a snow event, please remove promptly following the cleanup of your driveway.

To date the Board is happy with the performance of Colonial Waste (DBA Mr. Trashman). Mr. Trashman only observes six holidays a year. When one of these holidays falls on a Monday or Tuesday our trash/recycle schedule will be delayed one day. For the balance of 2018 the days are:

Memorial Day – Monday May 28, 2018, trash will be picked up on Wednesday May 30, 2018

Labor Day – Monday September 3, 2018, trash will be picked up on Wednesday September 5, 2018

Christmas Day – Tuesday December 25, 2018, trash will be picked up on Wednesday December 26, 2018

One of the new exclusions in the contract with Mr. Trashman is yard waste. Per the Massachusetts "Solid Waste" guidelines, yard waste is not to be included in the trash as it is decomposable and should

not go into a land fill. The Hudson Transfer station accepts yard waste. Stickers for the transfer station may be obtained at the Hudson Town Hall for free to senior citizens. One other option is if Dave's Landscaping is on site with a truck we can put yard waste into the truck, but NO PLASTIC BAGS, NO PLAS-TIC TRAYS, NO METAL, NO FLOWER POTS, ETC, JUST PLANT AND SOIL MATTER. PA-PER BAGS ARE PERMITTED.

The Board is scheduled to meet with Hayes Pump to discuss installing a transducer in the pump house. It will monitor the water usage and cycle down the "mission" pump when demand on water is lower (e.g., during the middle of the night). Currently the "mission" pump is running at full speed 24X7. If the pump cycles down during off peak hours it will save us electrical costs and extend the life cycle of the pump.

Following the recent snow, ice, and wind events, the Board suggests that unit owners/residents periodically check their lofts for water infiltration. Also check basements for leaking frozen spigot pipes that were not shut off properly.

Also check to make sure that the external vents for both the furnace and the water heater are cleared of ice and snow. It is the unit owner's/resident's responsibility to clear these vents.

Hope everyone is staying warm. We can now count the days until spring.

3. Web Browsers

Since Meltdown can be initiated via web sites using JavaScript applications, you can turn off Javascript on your browser although this may somewhat limit the browser's functionality.

Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Apple Safari, and Microsoft Edge all have scheduled updates.

Mozilla Firefox version 57.0.4 has security patches for both the Meltdown and Spectre exploits which disables a feature called SharedArrayBuffer. Firefox ordinarily updates itself when you open it by default. Or click on HELP >>> About Firefox to see if you have the latest version.

Google recommends turning on an optional feature in its Chrome browser called "Site Isolation" to protect against these chip flaws. Proper security patches will be included in Chrome 64, due out before the end of January. To turn on Chrome's Site Isolation, paste this on your Chrome address bar: chrome://flags#enablesite-per-process, then click Enable on "Strict Site Isolation."

Apple is set to release an update for Safari for Macs and iOS. The Company claims that its Safari fixes have no significant impact on its speed.

Microsoft will push its security fixes with Patch Tuesday updates including patches for Microsoft Edge and Internet Explorer 11.
